Data Flows from National to Regional/Global Level – Case Studies

- In response to the request by the Statistical Commission, at its 48th session, to develop guidelines on data reporting, the IAEG, at its 5th meeting, decided to carry out a series of case studies on data flows and data reporting.
- The goal of these case studies is to highlight the different ways in which data for the SDG indicators flows from the national to the regional/global level
- These studies were prepared by international agencies/custodian agencies in consultation with countries
- Case studies were prepared for seven representative indicators in order to highlight the different types of data being collected and the different ways in which it is transmitted.

Indicators included in case studies

The seven indicators included in these case studies are:

- **Indicator 1.1.1:** Proportion of population below the international poverty line, by sex, age, employment status and geographical location (urban/rural)
- **Indicator 2.1.2:** Prevalence of moderate and severe food insecurity
- **Indicator 3.3.2:** Tuberculosis incidence per 100,000 population
- **Indicator 4.2.1:** Proportion of children under 5 years of age who are developmentally on track in health, learning and psychosocial wellbeing, by sex
- **Indicator 11.3.1:** Ratio of land consumption rate to population growth rate
- **Indicator 15.5.1:** Red List Index
- **Indicator 16.3.2:** Unsensenced detainees as a proportion of overall prison population

Countries included in case studies

For each indicator, between 4 and 6 countries were selected and a case study was prepared on the particular data flow from that country to the agency. The country selection process sought to ensure there were examples from different types of National Statistical Systems and that there was geographic representativeness in the countries selected.
