



National data capacity




The national list of SDG indicators includes 255 indicators 94 indicators replaced and/or supplemented with 131 indicators proxies = match the global list 124 national indicators Data producers -26 government agencies and organisations Belstat - 101 indicators

75% of indicators from the national list are available:







SDG nationalization


