# UN World Data Forum 2018

- Hosted by the Federal Competitiveness and Statistics Authority of the United Arab Emirates from 22-24 October 2018, with support from the Statistics Division of the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs, the Statistical Commission and the HLG-PCCB.
- Attendance of +2,000 participants from 100 countries.
- The HLG-PCCB reviewed the final suggestions presented by the programme committee and made final decisions on the programmatic content from 480 proposals.
- The HLG-PCCB also developed some sessions to highlight important topics, such as their work on an efficient coordination of the UN statistical system and on financing for data and statistics.

# Dubai Declaration

- The official outcome document on the implementation of the Cape Town Global Action Plan and financing for statistics
- Reaffirms the Cape Town Global Action Plan as the common framework for the global data and statistical community to carry out the work to improve data for sustainable development and calls for the establishment of an innovative funding facility for data, entirely demand-driven, and under the guidance of representatives of statistical systems and different data and donor communities.
- Prepared by a subgroup led by South Africa, with inputs from Denmark, Switzerland, and Palestine and assistance by the Secretariat.
- The Declaration has two essential elements: implementation and financing of the CTGAP.



# Implementation of the Cape Town Global Action Plan for Data for the 2030 Agenda

- The joint HLG-PCCB and IAEG-SDGs subgroup collected country-level examples on the implementation of the CTGAP.
- Led by Denmark, the subgroup developed the paper “Better Data for Sustainable Development: Implementing the Cape Town Global Action Plan for Data for the 2030 Agenda”
