


Global vs National Reporting

Translation of SDGs into national priorities & metrics is easier for NSOs than global reporting

(n=40 countries)




SUBNATIONAL INDICATOR SET


SDG MEASUREMENT CHALLENGES
(n=37 countries)




Need for International Support

Majority of NSOs require further international support in SDG measurement

Key lessons learned

MEASUREMENT: Utilizing national data and integrating SDGs into domestic frameworks improves efficiency, reduces workload, saves resources, and enhances coherence

COOPERATION: Collaboration and early dialogue with policymakers are crucial. NSOs need a strong mandate to leverage interest in the next agenda, advocate for measurable targets, and secure resources for data production

COMMUNICATION: Communicating SDG indicators led to a better understanding of the role of data, boosting the visibility and relevance of official statistics while increasing demand for statistical insights across various dimensions

INNOVATION: Technology is vital but not a standalone solution. Delivering SDG statistics requires a robust data infrastructure, including people, processes, and organizational structures

Recommendations for NSOs

MEASUREMENT: Utilizing Guidelines and Tools developed by the UNECE Steering Group on SDGs can help improve data availability at national level

COOPERATION: Meeting data user needs requires collaboration within NSO, across NSS, and partnerships with external data providers, with clear role distribution. Engaging policymakers is crucial for securing support and resources

COMMUNICATION & INNOVATION: Enhancing data communication, developing user-tailored statistical products, and innovating for inclusivity are key to maximizing data use and demand

POST-2030 AGENDA: Entire statistical community should actively engage in shaping the next global framework. Early involvement strengthens official statistics and enhances their impact on policy success
