Civil society engagement in SDG work. Questions about how to measure this, as earlier indicator suggested was not possible. Initiative outside of IAEG-SDG is preparing to investigate new indicator for 2025 comprehensive review

- SDG goals 17, target 17.17 reads "Encourage and promote effective public, public-private and civil society partnerships, building on the experience and resourcing strategies of partnerships." In order to measure this target,
- indicator 17.17.1 is "Amount of United States dollars committed to (a) public-private and (b) civil society partnership
- A task team with participants from three stakeholder groups: development cooperation providers (donors), CSOs (affiliated with the CSO Partnership for Development Effectiveness) and partner country governments have contacted IAEG-SG to inform us that they plan to investigate how to find an indicator to propose for the next comprehensive review. No details are known on data sources or possible suggestions at this point. Still we felt it is good to inform you about this initiative. Contact can be made at www.taskteamcso.com

Preparation for 2025 Comprehensive Review

- Methodological development of any new indicator or revised indicator should:
 - Work with an international agency as the custodian agency of the indicator for methodology development and global data collection
 - Involve national statistical systems, in particular NSOs in methodology development;
 - 3. Conduct pilot studies that are regionally representative to test methodology
 - 4. Establish a road map for the methodology becoming an international standard
 - 5. Have the methodology approved
 - 6. Send the proposal to IAEG-SDGs for consideration in the 2025 Comprehensive Review
