HIGH-LEVEL POLITICAL FORUM ON SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

**First Global Workshop for 2025 Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs): Supporting Evidence-based VNRs
Incheon, Republic of Korea
3-5 December 2024**

Objective:

This workshop is intended for government officials engaged in coordinating and preparing voluntary national reviews (VNRs) in countries conducting review at the July 2025 High-Level Political Forum on sustainable development (HLPF). The workshop will facilitate practical exchange of experiences and knowledge among countries, as well as explore specific issues and challenges related to the VNR preparations.

To ensure a meaningful assessment of progress on the SDGs, reliable data and statistics are a crucial foundation for evidence-based VNRs and SDG reporting. Since adoption of the 2030 Agenda, countries have made significant strides in enhancing their monitoring frameworks for the SDGs, leading to improved inclusion of data and progress assessments in VNRs and overall SDG reporting. However, countries repeatedly point to the challenges of limited evidence, highlighting problems of data availability, data disaggregation, data collection as well as various human and financial constraints for SDG monitoring overall. These challenges have been further exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic and other crises, such as conflict and climate change. As a result, the breadth of analysis accessible for the VNRs and SDG reporting is impacted. To help address these challenges, countries are improving data integration, exploring data innovation, alternative and non-traditional data sources and enhancing coordination across government for better SDG reporting and information for VNRs. The workshop intends to provide guidance and exchange best practices on how to prepare evidence-based VNRs.

The workshop is organized by UN Department for Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA) and hosted by the United Nations Office for Sustainable Development (UNOSD) from 3-5 December 2024, in Incheon, Republic of Korea. The workshop will be held in person, with limited options for remote participation.

Participants:

The objective of the workshop is to bring together representatives responsible for the coordination and preparation of the VNR and from national statistical offices (NSOs) engaged in work on SDG reporting and the VNR process to share best practices for developing an evidence-based VNR and SDG reporting. The meeting will be open only to representatives of VNR countries and the UN Secretariat (UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs and UN regional commissions).

11:00 – 13:00	<p>Session 5: Whole of society coordination for implementation of the 2030 Agenda: Stakeholder engagement and Voluntary Local Reviews</p> <p>A key principle of the VNRs is that they should be inclusive and serve as a platform for launching partnerships for implementing the SDGs. Countries are encouraged to consult and engage non-state actors and civil society in their VNRs. They may also use their VNR to analyze barriers and obstacles to stakeholder engagement in the implementation of the SDGs as well as to improve mechanisms for consultation and participation. This session will provide guidance on how to effectively mobilize stakeholders throughout the VNR, including through mapping of stakeholder engagement in the VNRs.</p> <p>Localization of the 2030 Agenda is important in order to ensure ownership and implementation. Increasingly local governments and municipalities are preparing Voluntary Local Reviews.
