Brief description of the organization	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ ADB is an international development finance institution headquartered in Manila, Philippines. ■ From 31 members at its establishment in 1966, ADB has grown to encompass 68 members—of which 49 are from Asia and the Pacific. ■ ADB has 29 resident and regional missions, 8 country offices, a liaison office, and 3 representative offices. ■ ADB's main partners are governments, the private sector, non-government organizations, development agencies, community-based organizations and foundations. ■ ADB assists its members, and partners, by providing loans, technical assistance, grants, and equity investments to promote social and economic development.
Mission	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ ADB envisions a prosperous, inclusive, resilient, and sustainable Asia and the Pacific, while sustaining its efforts to eradicate extreme poverty in the region. ■ Under Strategy 2030, launched in 2018, ADB will sustain its efforts to eradicate extreme poverty and expand its vision to achieve a prosperous, inclusive, resilient, and sustainable Asia and the Pacific. ■ ADB aims to increase our capacity as the region's climate bank; strengthen our role as a catalyst for the private sector; and elevate our role as the region's solutions bank.
