1. DE FACTO BASIS OF CENSUS

EXPLANATORY NOTES

- 1.1 The population data are shown on a de facto basis, that is, according to the place where persons were enumerated.
- 1.2 Visitors from abroad who were present in the R.S.A. on holiday or business on the night of the census were enumerated but not included in the figures, while information of foreigners (and their families) who are studying or are economically active, have been included. Likewise, the Diplomatic and Consular Corps of foreign countries are also not included, nor are crew and passengers of ships, unless they were normally resident in the R.S.A. On the other hand, residents of the R.S.A. who were absent from the R.S.A. on census night were, as far as possible, enumerated on their return and included in the region where they normally reside. Personnel of the South African Government stationed abroad and their families were also enumerated. Such persons are included in the Transvaal (Pretoria).

3. CONCEPTS USED:

3.1 URBAN AND NON-URBAN AREAS

- 3.1.1 Urban areas are areas with some or other form of local authority.
- 3.1.2 Non-urban areas are industrial and mining towns which have no form of local government e.g. Kriel and the Nieu Largo Collieries town, as well as all other areas not included under "urban areas".

- 3.2 "BLACKS" include members of the following population groups: Xhosa, Zulu, Swazi, South Ndebele, North Ndebele, North Sotho, South Sotho, Tswana, Shangaan/Tsonga, Venda and Other Blacks (i.e. persons who belong to groups other than the aforementioned).

3.3 AGE

- 3.3.1 The question on age as it appeared in the census questionnaire was worded as follows: "State age in years at last birthday. For babies under one year, write "0".
- 3.3.2 Certain improbabilities can occur at the relatively higher ages and can probably be ascribed to the fact that some aged persons do not know exactly when they were born, stating their age on basis of estimation.
- 3.3.3 It will also be noticed that at certain ages, cases of digit preference occur, which is ascribable to the fact that certain people give preference to years ending for example on 0 or 5 and reporting their age as such.

3.4 MARITAL STATUS

- 3.4.1 In the census questionnaire marital status was called for as follows: "State whether never married, married, widowed, divorced or living together".
- 3.4.2 "Living together" means that a man and a woman are living together as husband and wife without being lawfully married (in terms of the legal requirements).
