*There is no explicit definition of literacy. Illiterate could be considered persons who declared during the filling in of their census questionnaire that they do not know how to read and write. All others could be considered literate. Children who were born after 1/1/2005 (younger than 6 years old) were excluded, as they had not had the opportunity to go to school yet.*
