The handbook for Global Value Chain is very important. But still in limited knowledge among developing countries. Therefore, the expert should share their experience especially for developing countries.

All TFITS members the reduction of bilateral trade asymmetries in merchandise trade and development of balanced merchandise trade statistics.	In ASEAN member countries, we do mirror analysis, but still there is a gap between countries. Asymmetries could not be avoided due to valuation of export in FOB and import in CIF, different exchange rate, and time of recording. Asymmetries can be reduced by: Customs office as the original source of data needs for further improvement of the system, recording of the true value of goods in the export/import declaration form, conducting bilateral consolidations between countries to further explore the possible causes of trade asymmetries.
