# Management of Migration Data Statistics: The experience of Jordan



#### **Background**

- Jordan has been one of the most country effected by the movement of migrants in the region.
- The number of migrants in Jordan reached 3million in 2015, represent 30% of the total population.
- As a result of the situation in Syria, Jordan received about 1.3 million migrants.
- Inflow of labor migrants from the neighboring countries mainly from Egypt has grown since the mid-1970s and accelerated during the last decades.

- Jordanian in other countries account of about 1 million.
- The net Migrant movements had adversely impact on different aspects of the country, mainly on the economy, labor market, education, health, infrastructure, demographic, social structure, public services, and other aspects.



  - Sample Surveys
  - Administrative Records

## Management of Statistical System

- 1. Jordan adopted National Strategy for Development of Statistics (NSDS) in order to organize the statistical work of all producers of data including the migration data.
- 2. A Higher Ministerial Committee was established to follow up the implementation SDGs.
- 3. Currently, Jordan's migration data is being improved through an existing project from the United Nations Statistics Division.
- 4. Strong cooperation among concerned institutions for improvement of administrative data.



# Future prospect for Development of Administrative Migration Data

- Transfer of best practice in migration data management.
- Setting up of the infrastructure for data preparation.
- Support an electronic linkage among concerned institutions.
- Building a platform for migration data dissemination.
- Raise the capacity of the DOS's staff and other concerned bodies.
