#### **UBOS Statistical Mandate**



To development and maintenance the National Statistical System (NSS) to produce and disseminate Official statistics to inform policy decisions and planning for All.

#### This involves;

- Co-ordination, monitoring and supervision of statistical production and use.
- Strengthening Local and International collaboration to provide better quality Gender responsive statistics.



#### **UN Women Support**



Uganda Bureau of Statistics receives support under the Memorandum of Understanding signed between UN Women and the Department for International Development (DFID) on 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2016 to implement the programme on "Supporting the Monitoring and Implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through Better Production and Use of Gender Statistics".

## Making Every Woman and Girl Count.

- Outcome I: Supportive and well-coordinated policy environment to ensure gender responsive localisation and effective monitoring of the SDGs.
- Outcome 2: Quality, comparable and regular gender statistics are available to address national data gaps and meet policy and reporting commitments under the SDGs, CEDAW and the Beijing Platform for Action.
- Outcome 3: Gender statistics are accessible to all users (including governments, civil society, academia and the private sector) and can be analysed to inform research, advocacy, policies and programmes and promote accountability





 National Priority Gender Equality Indicators(NPGEIs) Updated.

- 2. The National Plan for statistics (PNSD) includes Gender components and the NPGEIs
- 3. The National Standard Indicators(NSI) framework has adopted the NPGEIs.
- 4. Capacity Building program for gender statistics, covering 2019-2024, has been finalised.





 Capacity training conducted for staff in gender statistics(F:37, M:17) in the NSO, MDAs and CSOs.

- 7. A total of 43 Tier I indicators (NPGEIs) have been reprocessed and Four gender analytical reports on Tier I indicators are in production process.
- 8. Started review the administrative tools and methodology used by the Judiciary, Law and Order sector (JLOS) to produce gender-related data.





- 9. . A total of eight(8) thematic gender reports as per the NPGEIs are at completion stage.
- 10. In-depth Gender Analysis of the recent survey data has started with the support of technical consultants.

11. Two surveys on Time Use and Governance, Peace and Security were concluded and findings disseminated.





- 12 . Development of Gender profiles for key sectors is in the final stages. Sectors include; ICT, Energy, Agriculture, lands and Housing.
- 13. Conducted the second Annual Gender Statistics Forum (AGSF II) to disseminate the Gender Module of the National Governance, Peace and Security Survey (NGPSS) 2017, and discuss the policy implications.
- 14. Two surveys; Time Use survey and Governance, Peace and Security survey were conducted and findings disseminated.
- 15. Web-based Gender data Portal development is at final stage.
