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WHY REGISTERS MATTER?

- Quality registers as a basis for good governance
 - Registrations important for rights and services
- Social and economic development
- Transparency
- Report once → share information
- Increased benefits from coordinated and shared information
- Improved quality of registers and official statistics
- Reduced response burden for businesses and individuals
- Increased efficiency and lower costs for maintaining registers and statistical production



USING REGISTERS FOR OFFICIAL STATISTICS

- Directly for production of one or several statistics
- Cost and time efficient, reduces response burden
- National identification numbers facilitate linking registers
- Combined with data from surveys and "big data"
- As sampling frames
- For quality control
- All these applications may be relevant for establishing SDG indicators

SDG AND ADMINISTRATIVE REGISTERS

- Administrative registers as a source for SDG reporting
 - Include the entire population
 - Include more information
 - Updated regularly
 - National identification number
