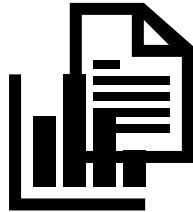

- ~90 countries between 2000-2017, with data disaggregated by sex
- Only 15% have 3 or more data points

UN Expert Group on Innovative and Effective Ways to Collect Time-Use Statistics

48th Session UN Statistical Commission (Decision 48/109)

The Statistical Commission:

- (b) Endorsed the International Classification of Activities for Time -Use Statistics (ICATUS 2016) for use as an international statistical classification, and appreciated the efforts of the countries and other experts who contributed to its finalization;
- (c) Supported the proposal to develop methodological guidelines on how to operationalize ICATUS 2016 and produce time-use statistics using the latest technologies, noted the countries that had expressed an interest in contributing to the guidelines, and also noted the need to provide technical assistance to countries, particularly in developing regions;

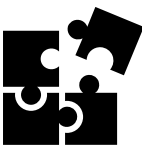

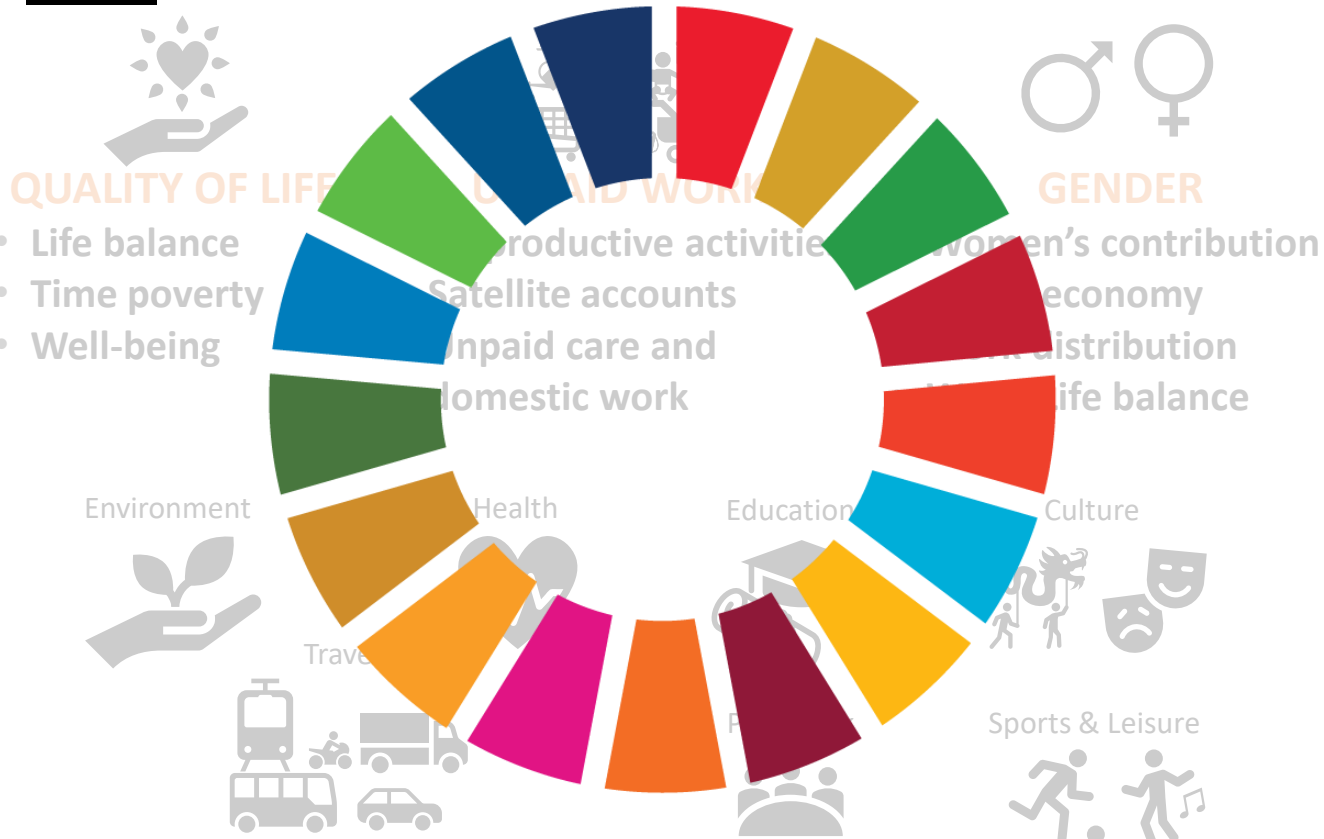

Promoting consistent concepts and definitions

- Facilitate discussions and **common understanding**
- Provide and promote **consistent and harmonized** terminology
- Be further developed into a dedicated chapter in the new UN Guidelines –add country examples and practices

Solutions: current focus



Ensuring high-quality data

- Developing a framework for defining **quality (multi-dimensional)**
- Anchored on agreed related frameworks:
 - UN National Quality Assurance Framework – **UN NQAF**
 - Generic Statistical Business Process Model – **GSBPM**



Applying latest technologies to modernize time-use data collection

- Recommend **digitalization of time-use data collections**
- Exploring use of technology and challenges (e.g. **access to/coverage of technology** for self-completed, potential “**mode effect**”)
- Learning from **Eurostat** and partners working on innovative tools for Household Budget Surveys and Time-Use Surveys

Solutions: current focus



Minimum Harmonized Instrument to promote more frequent collections

Questions capturing on economic characteristics



- Identification of persons employed during a specified time (week/7 days)
- For employed persons:
 - Multiple job-holding status
 - Core characteristics of the main / second / other jobs as relevant:
 - Status in employment
 - Occupation
 - Industry
 - Institutional sector of employment
 - Business incorporation for those employed in the private sector
 - Business registration

2022

UNSD and the Group will continue to work on the UN guidelines to be finalized

2023

UN Guidelines will be submitted to the UN Statistical Commission taking into account feedback received from countries on their implementation and adaptation of the proposed methods.
