



# **KEY CONSIDERATIONS**

- Legal mandate to maintain confidentiality
  - Statistics Act, 1984 Section 17
- Small society (2.7 million people)
- Small open economy (less than 40,000 establishments)
- The Institute's appetite for opening data
- Capacity for disclosure control
- Capacity to disseminate



# OTHER INITIATIVES AND DEVELOPMENTS

- Open Data Readiness Assessment done
- Open Data Policy being promulgated
- National decision to subscribe to the IMF's Special Data Dissemination Standard (SDDS)
- Data Protection Act being promulgated
- Stakeholder needs for improved analyses
- Increasing respondent apathy and privacy concerns










