




- General Trade statistical territory = economic territory

- In the case of inward processing if origin does not change these products remain foreign goods and should be recorded as re-exports.
- In the case of outward processing if origin does not change the compensating products remain domestic goods and should be recorded as re-imports.

Country Practice: China, Hong Kong SAR

HK offers assembling and testing for electronic toys in plastic casing

o This is inward processing

HK changes criteria country of origin if

- o Assembled in Hong Kong and
- O Containing 25% Hong Kong cost content attributable to local component parts and labor

If those criteria are not met, HK registers trade as re-export, otherwise export
