## **The Compilers Manual**

- The Manual has been prepared in accordance with the recommendation of the twenty-ninth session of the United Nations Statistical Commission:
- The primary purpose of the Manual is to assist Member States in implementation of the methodological guidelines adopted by the Commission and laid out in International Merchandise Trade Statistics: Concepts and Definitions, Revision 2 (IMTS, Rev.2);
- The Manual clarifies a number of basic concepts and identifies compilation practices that promote implementation of the IMTS, Rev.2;

#### **Compilers Manual (continued)**

- The manual builds upon a number of international conventions and agreements regarding customs procedures and trade policy matters, mainly those worked out by WTO and WCO.
- The Compilers Manual is on the process of being revised. As part of the revision exercise, questionnaires comprising of 13 sections with a total of 173 questions were sent to countries in 2006. The title of the questionnaire is National Compilation and Dissemination Practices (NCDP) in International Merchandise Trade Statistics.

#### **International Merchandise Trade Statistics (IMTS)**

#### **Compilers Manual (continued)**

- A total of 121 countries replied, out of which, 12 are South and Eastern African countries. With the exception of 3 questions, the allowed answer is either "Yes", "No" or "N/A". However, there is a comment column where countries may put any clarification for their replies. The result is shown in percentage of "Yes", "No" and "N/A".
- The results of selected questions for all respondents (121 respondents) and for South and Eastern Africa (12 respondents) are shown.
- It is followed by comparison of compliance to UN recommendations between 1996 and 2006 for all respondents and Africa (23 respondents).


