## **China Division Report**


## Summary\*\*

Since the 2023 session of the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names, China has actively promoted the legal reach of its management of geographical names and the standardization and integration of information technology in their management, while underscoring their cultural significance. Significant progress has been made in areas such as the naming, renaming, usage and cultural protection of place names.

The country's newly revised Regulations on the Management of Geographical Names have strengthened and standardized the management of geographical names at the institutional level. The Regulations set out in detail the implementing measures and the Measures for the Recording and Announcement of Geographical Names. They also promote the formulation or revision of national standards, such as norms for considering and approving the usage and pronunciation of characters, as well as standards for categorizing geographical names and for name signs. Additionally, they promote and provide guidance for relevant structures, such as those in civil aviation and meteorology, to introduce standards. The country's system for managing geographical names is gradually improving, providing robust legal guarantees as a basis for advancing high-quality development in geographical name management in the new era.

The Ministry of Civil Affairs of China has continuously updated and optimized the National Geographical Names Database, in terms of data and functionality. By integrating the record filing and announcement system into the platform, it has facilitated the dynamic publication of standardized information on geographical names. The database is gradually being transformed from an "annual version" system to a "daily update" model, significantly improving its management and operational efficiency, with the aim of supporting high-quality economic and social development.
