Role of geographical names in safeguarding cultural heritage in Saudi Arabia

Summary**

Geographical names in Saudi Arabia play an essential role in preserving and promoting cultural heritage. These names, often deeply connected to the country's history, religion and environment, are more than labels for places; they are symbols of identity, tradition and collective memory that safeguard the cultural richness of the nation.

Many of the geographical names in Saudi Arabia carry historical and cultural significance. For instance, Diriyah symbolizes the origin of the Saudi State and its unification, while Al-Ula calls to mind the ancient Nabataean civilization and the region's archaeological treasures. Such sacred sites as Makkah, Madinah, Badr and Mount Uhud resonate with Islamic heritage and serve as timeless reminders of the country's role as the cradle of Islam. The place name Al-Hasa evokes pivotal moments in history and reliance on natural resources like oases.

These names also reflect the geographical diversity of Saudi Arabia and the cultural traditions tied to its landscapes. For example, Thaimah and Al-Jouf recall ancient trade routes and early settlements that shaped the country's historical trajectory.

The Government has taken significant steps to protect this heritage through initiatives by the Ministry of Culture, the General Authority for Survey and Geospatial Information and the National Committee on Geographical Names. These efforts include the documentation and standardization of geographical names, as well as the creation of a national database and geographical names portal. Such measures
