Report of Italy

Summary**

Since the 2023 session of the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names, Italy has carried out the following activities:

- (a) Organization of three conferences, in collaboration with:
- (i) The Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei, on the theme "Literary, polar and extraterrestrial place names", in Rome, on 23 and 24 November 2023;
- (ii) The Romano-Hellenic Division of the Group of Experts, on the theme "Toponyms as a means of expressing identification, location, possession, belonging, division and respect for peoples' cultures", in close cooperation with the Italian Geographical Society, in Rome, from 11 to 13 September 2024;
- (iii) The Italian Centre for Historical and Geographical Studies, on the theme "Place names, perceptions and territorial portraits: critical lessons, methods and new perspectives between research and didactics", at the University of Salerno, Italy, on 10 and 11 December 2024;
- (b) Dissemination of actions relating to the importance of geographical names for the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals through lessons and conferences;
- (c) Creation of a research group within the Italian Association of Geographers, the body that brings together all Italian academic geographers;
 - (d) Implementation of a new Italian toponymic database.

For the next two-year period, the main Italian actions in the field of toponymic standardization will be aimed at:

- (a) Enriching and refining the new Italian toponymic database;
- (b) Organizing a thematic conference on the theme "Toponyms of the historical Italian linguistic minorities";
- (c) Contributing to the publication of a volume on minority place-name standardization in Europe, edited by Peter Jordan (Austria);
- (d) Arranging the fifth International Scientific Symposium of the Romano-Hellenic Division.
