United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names (UNGEGN)

1. New Legal Amendment (September 2024)

- Revised the Enforcement Decree of the Act on the Establishment and Management of Spatial Data.
- Officially includes youth (ages 19-34) as members of the Korea Committee on Geographical Names (KCGN).
- First youth member appointed in February 2025.

2. Why It Matters

- Promotes intergenerational dialogue and inclusive decision-making.
- Aligns with the UNGEGN Strategic Plan (2021–2029).
 - ✓ Fosters inclusiveness and cultural awareness.
 - \checkmark Enhances effective governance and communication.
- Supports UN SDG 16 (*Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions*)
 - Target 16.7: Ensure responsive, inclusive, participatory, and representative decision-making at all levels.

3. Key Impacts

- Empowers the next generation of naming professionals.
- Opens pathways for academic and civic engagement in toponymy.
- Sets a precedent for youth-inclusive policy in the region
