- Culturally-informed approaches recognizing the historical, linguistic and societal significance of names.
- Evidence-based decision making using research, data and best practices to guide standardization.

Thematic issues/questions:

Inclusivity

- The nature of inclusive solutions
- How to contribute to an inclusive/equal society?
- How to impact marginalized/ minority communities?
- Ensuring inclusive representation in naming?

Culturally-informed

- Should naming always be culturally-informed?
- indicators of discerning culturally-informed names
- always inherited from the past?
- How to handle when overlap of different cultures at the same location exists?

Thematic issues/questions:

Evidence-based

- Should always be evidence-based?
- What evidence? Quantitative or qualitative?
- What evidence, e.g. fieldwork, documents, crowd-sourcing, etc.?
- How to verify and validate names?
 Any reliability issues?
- How UNGEGN strengthens evidence-based practices?

Supporting sustainable development

- How to support sustainable development?
- Any examples where names promote social cohesion, economic growth or environmental sustainability?
- Policies or practices contributing to long-term sustainability in names standardization
